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Degree information

You will complete 22 courses (72 units) to finish your degree, with not more than 8 courses (24 units) at Level I and at least 16 courses (48 units) at Levels II and III. Most courses are worth 3 units each, except some Level III courses which are worth 6 units.

The Bachelor of International Development requires completion of core courses, International Development closed electives, a minor, and broadening electives.

International Development Courses

There are eight core courses (30 units) that you must complete for your degree. There are also five International Development closed elective courses (15 units), which you must choose from a specific list. Global Study and Internships

In addition to the opportunity to go on exchange for one or two semesters, the degree offers a range of in-country practice-focused experiences to a number of developing world countries, including Asia, Africa, Indonesia and Vietnam. The aim of these study abroad options is to further enhance the practice-based focus of the degree via students investigating the policies and activities of bilateral funders, multi-lateral organisations, national development agencies, as well as NGO and community-based organisations.

In addition to the option of completing the Arts Internship (ARTS 3200) as part of your degree, a number of professional internship opportunities will be awarded to graduating students with the highest grades at the end of each year.

The Minor

You will complete a minor as part of this degree comprising six courses (18 units) from one of the following disciplines crucial to contemporary development practice: *Anthropology, Asian Studies, Chinese Studies, French Studies, Gender Studies and Social Analysis, Geography, Environment and Population, History, Indigenous Knowledges and Society, Indonesian Studies, Japanese Studies, Politics and International Studies or Spanish Studies.*

Broadening Electives

You will complete three courses (9 units) from any discipline of the University available to you, excluding courses with the subject area of ANTH (Anthropology), ASIA (Asian Studies), DEVT (International Development), GEOG (Geography, Environment and Population), HIST (History), POLIS (Politics and International Studies), and courses with the subject area of your minor discipline.
