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### Degree information

You will complete up to 23 courses (72 units) to finish your degree, with not more than 8 courses (24 units) at Level I and at least 16 courses (48 units) at Levels II and III. Most courses are worth 3 units each, except some Level III courses which are worth 6 units.

The Bachelor of Social Sciences requires completion of core courses, Social Sciences closed electives, broadening and open electives.

### Social Sciences Courses

There are eight core courses (27 units) that you must complete for your degree. There are also up to four closed electives (12 units) which you must choose from a specific list.

- Criminology (CRIM)
- Politics and International Studies (POLIS)
- Sociology (SOCI)
- Psychology (PSYCHOL) (minor only).

### Electives Courses & Broadening

If you do not complete a major or a minor, you will complete eleven elective courses (33 units). Of these courses:

- A maximum of eight courses (24 units) can be chosen from other Faculties of the University. Any remaining electives must be chosen from disciplines within the Faculty of Arts.
- At least three courses (9 units) can be chosen from any discipline in the University available to you, excluding courses with the subject areas of ANTH, ASIA, DEVT, GEOG, GSSA, HIST, PHIL, POLIS or SOCI, and courses from your optional major or minor area (CRIM, POLIS or SOCI). These are known as broadening electives. Students who complete a minor in Psychology are exempt from this requirement.
