



Combined degrees and concurrent degrees

Students interested in pursuing studies in non-Music areas in tandem with their Music degree can do so in two ways.

Combined degrees

BA/BMus: The Faculty of Arts, Business, Law & Economics offers a combined Bachelor of Music/Bachelor of Arts (BA/BMus) combined degree. This degree is usually pursued over 5 years of full-time study but can also be taken part-time. Students usually pursue more of their Music studies in the early years and most of the Arts courses towards the end.

BTeach/BMus: The Faculty also offers a combined degree that involves the School of Education and the Conservatorium of Music. The Bachelor of Teaching (secondary) with Bachelor of Music combined degree is a four-year degree and is one of three pathways that lead to a recognised qualification in school music teaching.

As with all Music degrees, the Music component of both above combined degrees is only accessible upon completion of a successful <u>audition</u>.

Concurrent degrees

Students may also wish to pursue a second degree concurrently with their Music degree. This would usually involve beginning a Bachelor of Music degree first and then applying to also enrol in another of the University's degree. In the past, students have for example combined their Music degree with degrees in Engineering, Law, Commerce or Science.

The length of such concurrent degrees is variable and will depend on the student's overall workload and timetable management.
