

THYNE REID FOUNDATION MUSIC GRANT

GRANT RULES



BACKGROUND

The Thyne Reid Foundation was established to commemorate the memory of Mr Andrew Thyne Reid, an engineer and businessman. The Foundation encourages and supports the fields of medicine, science, arts, environment, education, social and community needs. The Foundation has been supporting students at the University of Adelaide since 2002.

The following rules are hereby made:

1. The Grant shall be known as the “Thyne Reid Foundation Music Grant” (‘Grant’).
2. Recipients must be Australian citizens, permanent residents of Australia or holders of a permanent humanitarian visa undertaking study as a Commonwealth supported student and must remain enrolled on a full time basis in the approved program for which the Grant was approved.
3. The annual value of the Grant is \$10,000, payable in two equal instalments direct to the student following confirmation of enrolment and satisfactory academic progress after each of the census dates (usually 26 March and 19 August each year).
4. One Grant shall be awarded to a student commencing one of the following programs at the University of Adelaide:
 - B. Mus (Advanced)
 - B. Mus (Classical Voice)
 - B. Mus (Jazz Performance)
 - B. Mus (Music Composition)
 - B. Mus (Music Ed & Pedagogy)
 - B. Mus (Musicology)
 - B. Mus (Popular Music)
 - B. Mus (Sonic Arts)
 - B of Music Theatre
 - B of Music (Classical Performance)
5. The Grant will provide assistance with education, living and accommodation costs for up to three years for which the recipient is offered the Grant, subject to the student maintaining a Grade Point Average of at least 5 (credit average) in each semester of enrolment.
6. The Grant will be offered once only in 2020.
7. The Grant must be taken up in the year in which it is offered; acceptance of the Grant offer cannot be deferred. If a student declines the Grant offer, the Grant will be offered to the next eligible student.
8. The Grant shall be administered by the Elder Conservatorium of Music.
9. Selection of the successful candidates will be made by the Director, Elder Conservatorium of Music based on the recommendation of the Conservatorium’s Scholarship Committee according to financial need and the outcome of an audition.

10. The Grant will be terminated where:

- a student ceases to be enrolled in the approved program of study at the University;
- a student has provided false or misleading information with regard to their personal details;
- a student has failed to maintain satisfactory academic progress for two consecutive semesters;
- a student is guilty of serious misconduct in terms of the University Policy Rules for Student Conduct in the University.

The University may vary the rules from time to time in consultation with the Donor in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
