

THE DAVID HESTER UNDERGRADUATE HONOURS PRIZE IN CLASSICS

Background

The prize was established by an initial contribution to the University by Stephanie Hester and Alexandra Grove (nee Hester), who are the daughters of Mr David Albert Hester, an academic staff member of the Department of Classics at the University of Adelaide for 46 years. Friends, colleagues and associates contributed towards the establishment of a prize fund to be held and invested by the University in perpetuity and the income to be used to award a prize annually.

Rules

- 1. A prize known as "The David Hester Undergraduate Honours Prize in Classics" shall be available for award annually.
- 2. The value of the prize shall be \$500 or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the prize does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund.
- 3. The prize shall be awarded on the recommendation of the Honours Selection Committee to the best third year student who has applied and has been accepted into Undergraduate Honours in Classics.
- 4. If, in any particular year, the examiner/s considers that no candidate is suitable for the prize, then no award shall be made.
- 5. If, in any particular year, the examiners deem that two or more candidates are of equal merit, the prize shall be divided equally between the candidates.
- 6. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and <u>policies</u>.
