

# THE CRIMINOLOGY PRIZES

## Rules

The School of Social Sciences has established the following prizes within their Department of Sociology, Criminology and Gender Studies to award students undertaking studies in the field of Criminology.

The following Rules now apply:-

The following group of prizes shall be called the "The Criminology Prizes".

#### Value

The prize shall comprise a medal for each prize.

# First Year Prize in Criminology: The Most Outstanding Criminology Student Level I

### **Title**

The first year prize shall be called the "The Most Outstanding Criminology Student Level I."

# **Eligibility**

To be eligible for the Prize, candidates must be undertaking all first year Criminology (CRIM) subjects in the year for which the Prize is awarded.

### Selection of Candidate

The Course Conveners shall award the prize to the candidate who achieves the highest average marks across first year Criminology (CRIM) courses.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the Prize will not be awarded in that year.

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then multiple prizes may be awarded.

#### **Variations**

The University may vary the Rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and <u>policies</u>.



## Second Year Prize in Criminology: The Most Outstanding Criminology Student Level II

#### **Title**

The second year prize shall be called the "The Most Outstanding Criminology Student Level II."

# **Eligibility**

To be eligible for the Prize, candidates must be undertaking all second year Criminology (CRIM) subjects in the year for which the Prize is awarded.

#### Selection of Candidate

The Course Conveners shall award the prize to the candidate who achieves the highest average marks across second year Criminology (CRIM) courses.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the Prize will not be awarded in that year.

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then multiple prizes may be awarded.

### **Variations**

The University may vary the Rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.

## Third Year Prize in Criminology: The Most Outstanding Criminology Student Level III

### **Title**

The third year prize shall be called the "The Most Outstanding Criminology Student Level III."

### **Eligibility**

To be eligible for the Prize, candidates must be enrolled in the Bachelor of Criminology program or Criminology Major sequence and undertaking the level three Criminological Research project in the year for which the Prize is awarded.

#### Selection of Candidate

The Program Coordinator for the Bachelor of Criminology shall award the prize to the candidate who achieves the highest marks in the level three Criminological Research project course.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the Prize will not be awarded in that year.

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then multiple prizes may be awarded.



#### **Variations**

The University may vary the Rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and <u>policies</u>.

# Honours Prize in Criminology: The Most Outstanding Honours Student in Criminology

#### Title

The Honours prize shall be called the "The Most Outstanding Honours Student in Criminology."

# **Eligibility**

To be eligible for the Prize, candidates must be enrolled in the Honours Degree of Bachelor of Criminology program and undertaking all the honours level Criminology (CRIM) courses in the year for which the prize is being awarded.

### Selection of Candidate

The Head of Department shall award the prize to the candidate who achieves the highest average marks in the honours level Criminology (CRIM) courses.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the Prize will not be awarded in that year.

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then multiple prizes may be awarded.

### **Variations**
