Degree information

You will complete 24 courses (72 units) to finish your degree, with not more than 6 courses (18 units) at Level I and at least 18 courses (54 units) at Levels II and III. Most courses are worth 3 units each, except some Level III courses which are worth 6 units.

The Bachelor of Arts (Advanced) requires completion of:

- A minimum of 12 units and a maximum of 18 units at Level I
- core courses to the value of 12 units
- two Arts majors to the value of 24 units each (one major will include ARTS 3002)
- Six open electives (18 units)

Core Courses (ARTS 3003 and 3002)

ARTS 3003 Advanced Humanities Theory and ARTS 3002 Research Project should be taken in your final year of study. ARTS 3002 Arts Advanced Research Project replaces the designated capstone in a second non-language major.

Level II and III Prerequisites

Level II and III course prerequisites are waived for BA(Adv) students so you can study advanced courses from first year. However, it is recommended that you complete the minimum four Level I courses (12 units) first. The prerequisite for capstone courses must be observed.

The Majors

Each major comprises up to eight courses (24 units) chosen from one of the following areas of study: *Anthropology, Asian Studies, Chinese Studies, Classics, Creative Writing, Criminology, International Development (formerly Development Studies), English, European studies (not available to new students), French Studies, Geography, Environment & Population, Gender Studies (formally Gender Studies & Social Analysis), German Studies, History, Indigenous Knowledges & Society, Japanese Studies, Linguistics, Media & Music (new form 2017), Music, Philosophy, Politics & International Studies, Sociology, and Spanish Studies.*

***Note: Only one language major may be presented.**
