Degree information

You will complete 96 units to finish your degree, comprising at least 12 units (and a maximum of 24 units) at Level I, and a minimum of 72 units at Levels II, III, and IV. Most courses are worth 3 units each, except some Level III courses which are worth 6 units.

- i. not more than 24 units at Level I
- ii. core courses to the value of 45 units
- iii. a major to the value of 24 units
- iv. a minor to the value of 18 units, or 21 units for a minor in Psychology (and no open elective courses)
- v. open electives to the value of 9 units

The Major

Eight courses (24 units) from one area of study. You must complete a maximum of 6 units at Level I, at least 18 units at Levels II and III.

The Minor

Six courses (18 units) from one area of study. You must complete a maximum of 6 units at Level I, at least 12 units at Levels II and III. Your minor must be in a different area of study than your major.

Major and Minor Areas

Your major and minor must be chosen from the following areas:

- English
- English as a Second Language (Linguistics)
- Geography, Environment and Population
- History
- Languages: Chinese Studies, German Studies, Indonesian Studies, Italian Studies, Japanese Studies, Modern Greek Studies, Spanish Studies
- Music (Classroom)
- Psychology (minor only)
