Structure of the Diploma

To complete the Diploma in Languages, you will study 8 courses (24 units) in a single language with not more than 2 courses (6 units) at Level I. Most courses are worth 3 units each. The language sequence must normally be completed over a three-year period due to the sequential nature of language teaching and course pre-requisites.

All courses must be studied in the same language (different languages cannot be incorporated into the Diploma). Languages can be studied at beginner's or continuer's level.

The above plan represents the standard language major structure for the majority of languages. Variations to this structure will be outlined in the major list for your chosen language.

Credit for University of Adelaide Students

If you are studying a Faculty of Arts degree concurrently with the Diploma in Languages, you may receive credit for up to 12 units of Diploma in Language courses towards elective courses in your primary degree. This means that you may be able to complete a 3-year bachelor's degree and a Diploma in Languages in 3.5 years of study. Please seek advice from the Faculty of Arts Office.

If you are studying a degree in another faculty, you will need to discuss the possibility of receiving credit from the Diploma toward your primary degree with the relevant faculty office.
