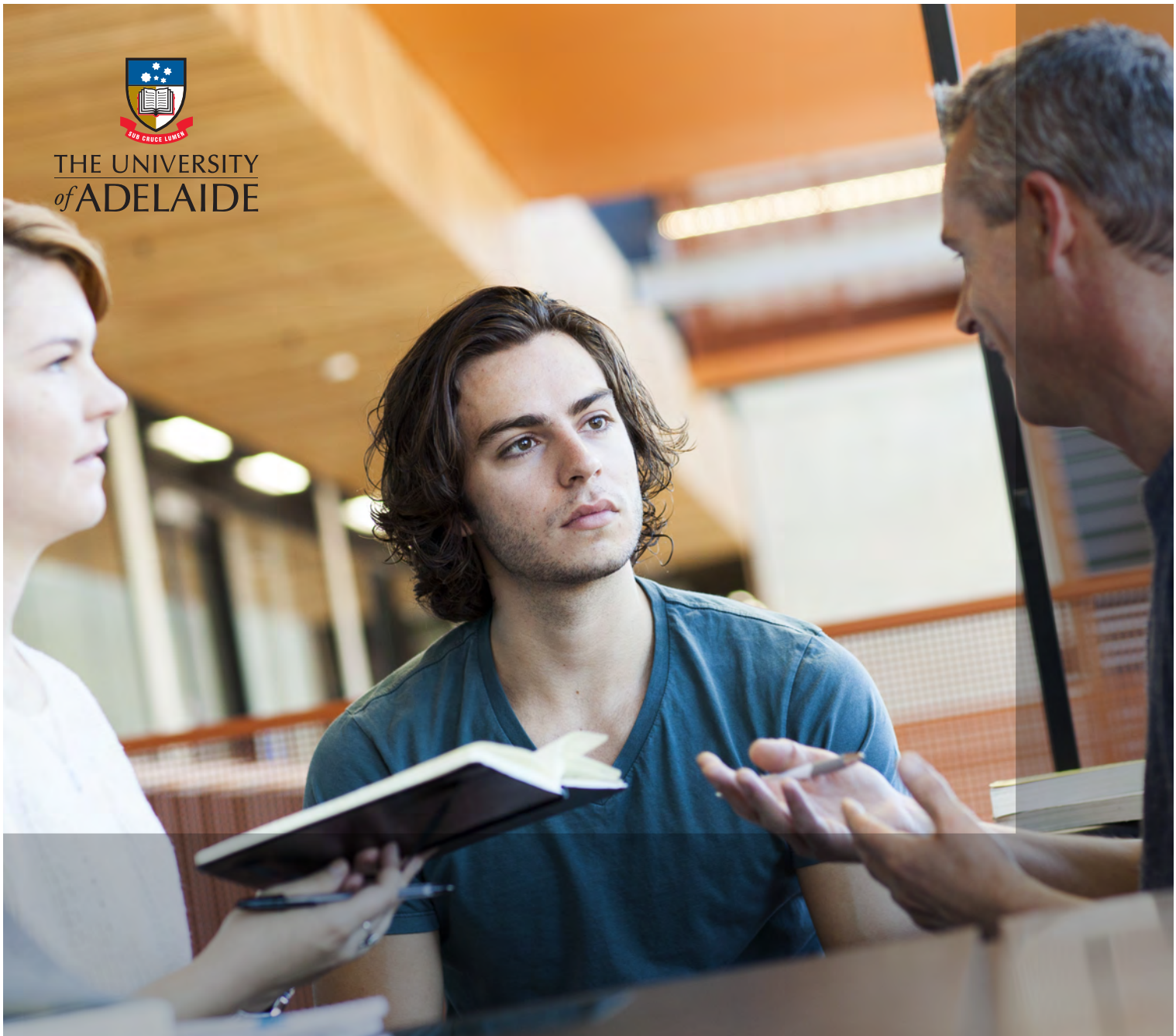

It is for those who already have a degree specialising in subjects relevant to middle and secondary school teaching (years 7 - 12).

The Master of Teaching degree is a 48 unit (2 year) program taught in accelerated mode (1.25 year). Fees are based on the number of units you enrol in.

Professional Experience

Practical experience in a middle and/or secondary school setting is vital to develop your teaching skills.

The blocks of professional experience include:

Year 1 - 2 blocks of 25 days

Year 2 - 1 block of 20 days

Professional experience placements are taken on a full-time continuous basis.

Professional Accreditation

This program is accredited by the Teachers Registration Board of South Australia. Graduates may register to teach in South Australia, and in most cases interstate and overseas.

You can extend the Bachelor of Teaching to a Master of Teaching after completing the third year if you have a GPA of 5 or above.

Entry Requirements

The Teaching Capabilities Statement is part of the application process. It explains your motivation to become a teacher. The statement covers three themes:

- your understanding of the role of a teacher
- your personal and academic qualities that will enable you to become an effective teacher
- your attitude to learning.

Additional Requirements

In accordance with state and national legislation, you will also need to meet the following requirements during the degree:

- the Child Protection Curriculum an approved Responding to Abuse and Neglect course.
- Working With Children Check (WWCC) before you go on placement
- both components of the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education (LANTITE) before your final placement. Learn more at teacheredtest.acer.edu.au.

You will need to take into consideration the additional cost for each of these requirements.
