In 2019, the School of Education launched the eLearning program.

The program aims to raise pre-service teachers' digital capabilities in an educational context, so that they may become contemporary and innovative teachers for 21st-century schools and classrooms.

The eLearning program runs throughout the Bachelor of Teaching, and involves workshops, activities, events and meaningful integration in resources and assessments throughout the course.

The eLearning program uses iPad Pros to help students become fluent in a range of established and emerging learning technologies.

These include learning management systems, multimodal assessments, augmented reality, learning analytics, cybersafety and digital citizenship.

By the end of 2019, over 90% of the participating cohort had achieved Apple Teacher status; an internationally recognised qualification showing their advanced level of proficiency in use of digital technologies for learning.
