Majoribanks Oration

Professor Kevin Marjoribanks (1938 - 2006) was appointed Professor of Education at The University of Adelaide in 1974, served as Vice-Chancellor of the University of Adelaide from 1987 to 1993, and retired as Dean of the School of Education in 2005.

His life-long research focused on the analysis of inequalities in education.

He was visiting scholar to universities such as the University of Oxford, Stanford University and Harvard University, and Foundation Editor of the Oxford Review of Education and Australian Journal of Education .

The Kevin Majoribanks Memorial Lecture was established in 2007 in honour of the late Emeritus Professor Kevin Majoribanks; the University of Adelaide's Vice-Chancellor from 1988 to 1993, and the Dean of School of Education until his retirement in 2005.

Professor Kevin Marjoribanks championed intellectual life of the University community and colleagues he worked with and constantly promoted his passion for scholarship and in quality of teaching.

Professor Majoribanks believed that education is a life-long commitment and does not happen in a vacuum but involves the careful orchestration and input from the family, culture and society.

His research led to greater understanding of the substantial impact that parents and other

family members have on children's educational opportunities.

He was also passionate about teacher education and teachers professional learning. Professor Majoribanks believed that good teaching is linked intimately to active research.

In his work, he not only touched many who studied under him, but also influenced scholars around the world.

Professor Majoribanks published over eight books and some 250 articles. His last significant book publication was "Family and Social Capital: Towards a Context Theory of Students' School Outcomes".

The memorial lectures, past and present, honour Professor Majoribanks' legacy and continues the fine tradition of discourse, dialogue and debates within the educational community and enhances further an inclusive education context for all to excel.

In 2019 to present the Marjorianks Oration, we welcomed Professor **Pasi Sahlberg** as Professor of Education Policy, and Research Director at the Gonski Institute for Education, University of New South Wales, Sydney.

Professor **Pasi Sahlberg** worked as a mathematics and science teacher, teacher-educator, researcher, and policy advisor in Finland.
