

THE ANTHONY PATTEN MASTER OF EDUCATION PRIZE

Rules

This endowed prize has been established through a kind donation from Virginia Earle, the widow of Anthony Patten (M Ed 2018), in recognition of Anthony's belief in the power of education and the wonderful legacy he left in supporting and promoting the educational achievements of students with a disability.

Rules

1. The Prize will be called the "Anthony Patten Master of Education Prize".
2. The purpose of the Prize is to encourage excellence in the research projects completed by students undertaking a Master of Education.
3. One prize shall be awarded annually and the value of each prize shall be \$500 or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the prize does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund.
4. The Prize will be available each year to students undertaking a Master of Education in the Faculty of Arts
5. The Prize will be awarded to the student who achieves the highest Grade Point Average (GPA) at the end of Semester 1 each academic year.
6. If more than two candidates are considered of sufficient and comparable merit, the Prize may be shared equally.
7. If no candidate is considered of sufficient merit, no award shall be made and an additional award may be made in the subsequent year.
8. The University may vary these rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
