

## FACULTY OF ARTS MUSIC THEATRE SCHOLARSHIP SCHOLARSHIP RULES

---

### BACKGROUND

The Faculty of Arts Music Theatre Scholarship has been established by The Faculty of Arts to support five undergraduate students who are undertaking a Bachelor of Music Theatre Program of study at the University of Adelaide.

The following rules are hereby made:

### RULES OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

1. The Scholarship shall be known as “The Faculty of Arts Music Theatre Scholarship.”
2. Recipients must remain enrolled on a full time basis in the approved program for which the Scholarship was approved.
3. The annual value of the Scholarship is \$3,000 payable in two equal instalments direct to the student following confirmation of enrolment and satisfactory academic progress after each of the census dates (usually 31 March and 31 August each year).
4. Five Scholarships shall be awarded to commencing students who accept a place in the Bachelor of Music Theatre program at the University of Adelaide.
5. The Scholarships will be offered in 2019 only and are tenable for one year.
6. The Scholarship will provide assistance with education and living costs for the first year of the Bachelor of Music Theatre Program, subject to the student maintaining satisfactory Academic Progress.
7. The Scholarships must be taken up in the year in which they are offered; acceptance of the Scholarship offer cannot be deferred. If a student declines the Scholarship offer, it will be offered to the next eligible candidate. If there is no suitable candidate for the Scholarship it will not be offered.
8. The Scholarship shall be administered by the Faculty of Arts at the University.
9. In considering eligible candidates for the Scholarships the Head of Music Theatre will take into account the level of performance as demonstrated at audition and the likely benefit to be derived by the candidate and the University.
10. Students in receipt of other University of Adelaide Scholarships are eligible for this Scholarship.
11. The Scholarship will be terminated where:
  - a student ceases to be enrolled in the approved program of study at the University;
  - a student has provided false or misleading information with regard to their personal details;

- a student has failed to maintain satisfactory academic progress for the first semester of the Scholarship.
- a student is guilty of serious misconduct in terms of the University Policy Rules for Student Conduct in the University.

12. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
