The Major

Not more than 6 units of Culture courses may be included in the minor. Your minor area must be different to your major.

All courses are 3 units at the University of Adelaide and 4.5 units at Flinders University, unless indicated otherwise. **Please refer to enrolment instructions on page 2.**

Teaching Requirements

The School of Education has **additional requirements** that you **must** comply with for the Teachers Registration Board of South Australia. To be eligible for 'Italian Curriculum & Methodology' (Teaching Area) in Year 4:

1. Students must undertake six language courses to achieve a Teaching Area.
2. If a student has been given an exemption for Level I language courses, they must still complete six courses, two from Level II, two from Level III and two more advanced language subjects (usually at Level III).
3. If a student has been given an exemption for Level I language courses and they have a minimum of four language courses and there is no other additional advanced language courses available, only then, are they permitted to undertake a cultural language course that can be counted to their Teaching Area. The maximum number of cultural courses to be counted towards a Teaching Area is two, and at every opportunity students are required where available to undertake language courses.
