

## The Springer Nature Prize in Digital Humanities Rules

### Establishment

This Prize has been established by the University as a result of a donation from Springer Nature – a global publishing company. Springer Nature has agreed to support the Prize for 1 year only (2019) but may extend the Prize upon agreement with the University.

### Value

There value of the Prize will be AUD1,000.

### Eligibility

To be eligible for the Prize students must be undertaking a course in Digital Humanities including:

- COMP SCI 1101, 1102, 1104, 2203;
- Arts 2002, 2003;
- CRIM 2001;
- CRWR 2067;
- HIST 2084, HIST 2089, HIST 3059;
- MEDIA 2336;
- PHIL 2030, 2050;

and be using the Springer Archive as a significant source of their work. The Springer Archive must be used in an assessment task in these courses or in any other course of the University.

### Selection of Candidate

The Prize will be awarded by a selection panel including the Head of School of Humanities (Chair) and another academic in the Digital Media field to the student whose assessment task employs the Springer Archive in the most innovative and original way. If there is no student of merit the prize will be deferred until the following year. If there are two students of equal merit the prize can be shared equally.

### Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
