Arts Major

You must complete one Arts major of at least 24 units comprising:

- At least 3 units (and a maximum of 6 units) at Level I,
- At least 3 units at Level II,
- At least 6 units at Level III, and
- A 6-unit capstone course. (ARTS 3002 Advanced Research Project substitutes the capstone major).

For a major in languages you must complete:

- A maximum of 6 units at Level I,
- A maximum of 9 units at Level II and
- A maximum of 9 units at Level III. (ARTS 3002 Advanced Research Project substitutes the 6 units at level III).
