

THE FAY GALE PRIZE IN GEOGRAPHY

Rules

Background

In 2008, Professor Fay Gale provided funding to the University to establish an annual prize in the Department of Geography, Environment and Population for the purpose of encouraging and rewarding excellence in the study of Cultural or Indigenous or Human Geography.

The following Rules now apply:-

1. The Prize shall be called 'The Fay Gale Prize in Geography'.
2. The value of the Prize shall be \$300, or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the prize does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund.
3. To be eligible for the Prize, students must be enrolled in the advanced level Cultural, Indigenous and Human Geography courses towards a Geography major, in the year for which the Prize is awarded.
4. The Prize shall be awarded to the student, who in the opinion of the Head of the Department of Geography, Environment and Population, has attained the most outstanding overall result for the year.
5. If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then the prize may be shared equally.
6. If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the Prize will not be awarded in that year and the available distribution of interest will be added to the capital sum in the Endowment Fund.
7. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and [policies](#).
