Step 2: Apply

Step 3: Register online for your audition

All international applicants living in Adelaide must attend an audition/interview at the University of Adelaide.

Overseas and interstate applicants may submit a recorded audition/folio of works (please note, only international applicants may submit a recorded audition for the Bachelor of Music Theatre).

- Mid-year entry round: Monday 6 July
- Main round: Monday 28 September to Friday 2 October
- Second round: Monday 23 November to Friday 27 November

Step 4: Check your audition requirements

Check your [audition requirements](#) by the program you have applied for.

All successful undergraduate applicants undertaking an audition/interview must sit the musicianship test. Diploma programs are excluded from this requirement.

Step 5: Prepare

Please ensure you have followed the audition requirements for your specialisation. The Conservatorium does not provide accompanists - you will need to contact the [Accompanists' Guild of SA](#) if you require one for your audition.

Applicants should contact accompanists as early as possible as auditions cannot be rescheduled to accommodate accompanist availability.

On the day of your audition, please ensure you arrive 15 minutes prior to your audition or interview. You will receive notification of your audition outcome following your audition.

Step 6: Musicianship test

All applicants sit the musicianship test. The test is online and is open for 2 weeks from mid-December. Successful applicants will be sent an email with log-on and other details as soon as the test is ready.

The test assesses your level of musicianship, and includes the ability to identify and recognise musical concepts within aural, written and theoretical contexts.

Bridging courses

The bridging course in music theory is for students commencing their studies who have not studied Stage 2 Musicianship or AMEB Grade 5 Theory or Musicianship. The course aims to fast-track essential music theory topics in a functional and musical way.

The bridging course in music history brings together the breadth and variety of composers, dates, genres, periods and works, and makes sense of it all by painting a picture of what happened when, and why, in music's history.

Bridging courses will be run in February.
