Degree information

You must complete 72 units to finish your degree, comprising at least 12 units (and a maximum of 24 units) at Level I, and a minimum of 48 units at Levels II and III - with at least 18 units at Level III. Courses are worth 3 units each, unless specified otherwise.

Compulsory Course

You must complete ARTS 1007/OL The Enquiring Mind.

Arts Major

You must complete one Arts major of at least 24 units comprising:

- At least 3 units (and a maximum of 6 units) at Level I,
- At least 3 units at Level II, and
- At least 6 units at Level III
- 6-unit capstone course.

For a major in languages you must complete:

- A maximum of 6 units at Level I
- A maximum of 9 units at Level II, and
- A maximum of 9 units at Level III

If you complete a second major, you do not need to complete a minor.

Arts Minor

You must complete one Arts minor in a different area of study from the major (or one minor in International Business, Management or Marketing). The minors comprise at least 18 units. Where pathways are not structured, you must complete:

- At least 3 units and a maximum of 6 units at Level I
- A minimum of 3 units and a maximum of 6 units at Level II
- A maximum of 6 units at Level III
- The capstone is not available in the minor.

The minor is not required in a double degree, but you can choose to study a minor.

You can undertake an Arts major or minor in the following areas of study: Anthropology, Art History and Visual Culture, Asian Studies, Australian Studies, Chinese Studies, Classics, Creative Writing, Criminology, Cultural Studies, Digital Humanities, Economics, Education, English, Film Studies, French Studies, Gender Studies, Geography, Environment & Population, German Studies, History, History and Philosophy of Science (minor only), Indigenous Knowledges & Society,

International Development, Italian Studies, Japanese Studies, Linguistics, Mathematical Sciences, Media, Modern Greek Studies, Music, Philosophy, Politics & International Relations, Psychology[^], Sociology, Spanish Studies.

[^] If you choose to study a Psychology major or minor, please see separate study plans: *Bachelor of Arts with a major in Psychology* or *Bachelor of Arts with a minor in Psychology*.

The following majors or minors may only be taken in addition to an Arts major: International Business, Management or Marketing.

Electives

You must complete 27 units of elective courses. Of these:

- A maximum of 24 units can be chosen from other Faculties of the University. For all elective options, visit the University course planner: <https://access.adelaide.edu.au/courses/search.asp>

All remaining electives must be chosen from disciplines within the Faculty of Arts, see: www.arts.adelaide.edu.au/study-with-us/student-support/enrolment-help/study-plans

- At least 9 units must be from outside your major and minor areas. These are known as broadening electives.
- Students who complete a second major are exempt from this requirement only where a second major is presented that is not from the same study area.
