### Degree information

You must complete 72 units to finish your degree, comprising at least 12 units (and a maximum of 24 units) at Level I, and a minimum of 48 units at Levels II and III with at least 18 units at Level III. Courses are worth 3 units each, unless specified.

### Compulsory course

You must complete 12 units of compulsory courses as follows:

- ARTS 1008 The Enquiring Mind Arts Advanced
- ARTS 3003 Advanced Humanities: Theory and Method
- ARTS 3002 Advanced Arts Research Project

### Majors

You must complete **two** Arts majors of at least 24 units. One major will include ARTS 3002 (replacing the designated capstone in a second non-language major).

For non-language majors you must complete:

- At least 3 units (and a maximum of 6 units) at Level I
- At least 3 units at Level II, and
- At least 6 units at Level III
- 6-unit capstone or ARTS 3002 in 2<sup>nd</sup> non language major

For a language major (only one language may be studied) you must complete:

- A maximum of 6 units at Level I
- A maximum of 9 units at Level II, and
- A maximum of 9 units at Level III.

Majors are available in the following areas of study:

Art History and Visual Culture, Anthropology, Asian Studies, Australian Studies, Chinese Studies, Classics, Creative Writing, Criminology, Cultural Studies, Digital Humanities, Economics, Education, English, , Film Studies, French Studies, Geography, Environment & Population, Gender Studies, German Studies, History, Indonesian Studies, International Development, Italian Studies, Indigenous Knowledges & Society, Japanese Studies, Linguistics, Mathematical Sciences, Media, Modern Greek Studies, Music, Philosophy, Politics & International Relations, Psychology<sup>^</sup>, Sociology, Spanish Studies.

### Level II and III Prerequisites

Level II and III course prerequisites are waived for this program, allowing advanced courses to be taken from first year. It is recommended that a minimum of 12 units of Level I courses be successfully completed first. The prerequisite for capstone courses must be observed.

You must complete 18 units of elective courses. Electives can be from the same or different areas of study. Ensure that you check any restrictions and pre-requisites.
