### Compulsory Course

You must complete ARTS 1007/OL The Enquiring Mind.

### Criminology Course

You must complete 24 units of Core courses, and 12 units of Criminology Closed Electives from the list on page 2. Ensure that you check any restrictions and pre-requisites.

### Elective

You must complete 33 units of elective courses, **unless undertaking a major or minor**. Electives can be from the same or different areas of study. At least 9 units can be chosen from any discipline other than courses with the subject areas CRIM or GEOG. Ensure that you check any restrictions and prerequisites.

## Politics Major / Minor

### Major

The simplest way to plan your major is:

- 6 units at level I
- 6 units at level II
- 12 units at level III. This includes the 6 unit capstone course.

### Minor

18 units of courses including: a minimum of 3 units and a maximum of 6 units at level I; a minimum of 3 units at level II; and a minimum of 6 units at level III. No capstone is required for the minor. Your minor area must be different to your major. The simplest way to plan your minor is:

- 6 units at level I
- 6 units at level II
- 6 units at level III.
