Degree information

You must complete 72 units to finish your degree, comprising not more than 24 units at Level I, not more than 24 units at Level II, and not more than 24 units at Level III. Courses are worth 3 units each, unless specified otherwise.

Compulsory Course

You must complete ARTS 1007/OL The Enquiring Mind.

International Relations Course

You must complete 15 units of Core courses and 18 units of International Relations Closed Electives from the list on page 2. Ensure that you check any restrictions and pre-requisites.

Compulsory Language Course

You must complete a minimum of 9 units in Language Studies as follows:

- 6 units of Language at Level I, and
- 3 units of Language or Culture at Level II.

You can choose a language from the following: *Chinese Studies, French Studies, German Studies, Indonesian Studies, Italian Studies, Modern Greek Studies, Japanese Studies or Spanish Studies.*

*You are exempt from completing this language component if:

- You are an International student
- You are studying a Diploma in Languages, or
- You are studying a language major/minor in another degree.

Students who are exempt from study must complete International Relations Closed Electives or a different language.

Minor

You must complete a minor comprising 18 units from one of the following disciplines: Asian Studies (refer pg 3), Geography Environment and Population (refer pg 4), History (refer pg 5), International Business (refer pg 7), or International Development (refer pg 8).

Elective

You must complete 9 units of elective courses (or 0 units if undertaking optional language minor). Electives can be from the same or different areas of study. Ensure that you check any restrictions and pre-requisites.
