Social Sciences Course

You must complete 27 units of Social Sciences Core courses and 12 units of Social Sciences Closed Electives from the list on page 2. If undertaking ARTS 3200 Arts Internship you must only complete 6 units of Closed Electives. Ensure that you check any restrictions and pre-requisites.

Psychology Minor

The Psychology minor comprises 21 units of Psychology courses including 9 units at Level I, 6 units at Level II, and 6 units at Level III.

Please Note: the minimum requirement for entry into Honours in Psychology is a 33-unit major in psychology. A minor in psychology is not accredited by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) and will not lead to the Honours year.
