Our Master of Arts challenges you to think, perform and grow to new levels.

You'll develop specialised knowledge in your field of study and advanced research and communication skills.

A master will also give you a competitive edge in community and Arts careers around the globe.

What will you do?

- Take 12 units worth of core courses in your chosen discipline.
- Work in close contact with research active academics.
- · Benefit from small group learning.
- Intern in an organisation tied to your career aspirations.
- Apply and share your learning in a capstone thesis.

Degree Structure

Experience a variety of teaching approaches, from face-to-face lectures, seminars and workshops to blended learning.

We have embedded small group learning and regular close contact with research active academics across the program.

You'll complete 12 units worth of core courses and a thesis also worth 12 units, so you can pursue your interests in-depth.

Unique to this degree is an internship so you gain hands-on experience in an organisation related to your career aspirations.

You will take elective courses from outside of your discipline area to develop cross-disciplinary thinking and the ability to apply it to solve complex problems.

Areas of Specialisation

Creative Practice in Music

Get the practical, theoretical and conceptual tools to enter the world of music in the 21st century as a creative artist.

Use digital technology across the fields of sonic art, sound design and composition, including the application to contemporary media such as film and games.

Explore a variety of different approaches and styles, from popular to experimental, to compile a professional portfolio of creative work.

Environmental Studies

Develop an understanding of the principles and practice of environmental policy, planning and governance.

Responding effectively to environmental problems involves far more than the application of scientific knowledge, or the 'top-down' regulation of people and their environments.

Government policies must be negotiated with, and implemented through, diverse private-sector agents and a differentiated civil society.

Managing environmental problems involves a new set of approaches, including government, public-private partnerships, economic tools and incentives, democratic decentralisation and risk management.

International Relations

Explore the character of the contemporary world and gain an advanced understanding of the key issues and debates in international politics.

You will cover a wide range of teaching and research, including:

- strategic and security studies
- contemporary international thought
- gender perspectives in international relations
- international political economy
- issues of equity and inequality in the international sphere
- power, culture and communication
- · Asian studies and European studies.

Where could it take you?

Graduates from the Creative Practice in Music stream have performance opportunities in public and private practice, and often undertake teaching in the private studio.

Environmental Studies graduates can take up senior policy roles in government and a variety of roles in environmental management for government agencies, industry and the not-for-profit sector.

International Relations graduates make successful careers in roles such as security adviser, political analyst, political reporter, foreign affairs reporter, intelligence analyst and within international organisations such as the United Nations.
