Practical experience in a school setting is vital to develop your teaching skills. You will have yearly placements in schools (80 days in total over the duration of your program). We also offer internships in the final year of the program.

Professional Accreditation

This program is accredited by the Teachers Registration Board of South Australia. Graduates may register to teach in South Australia, and in most cases interstate and overseas.

The Teaching Capabilities Statement is part of the application process. It explains your motivation to become a teacher, and:

- your understanding of the role of a teacher
- your personal and academic qualities that will enable you to become an effective teacher
- your attitude to learning.

Additional Requirements

You need to meet the following requirements during the degree:

- the Child Protection Curriculum
- Responding to Abuse and Neglect training
- Working With Children Check (WWCC) prior to placement
- the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education (LANTITE).
