UNITS AND LEVELS	You must complete a total of 108 units of courses, with: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> at least 12 units and no more than 24 units of Level 1 courses
CRIMINOLOGY	You must complete 33 units of Criminology courses, which includes 9 units of Criminology Closed Electives.
LAW	Law courses are a guide only. Please contact the Adelaide Law School for specific advice. *Law Students are eligible to enrol into any level of Law Elective for which they meet the pre-requisite requirements.

PLEASE NOTE

- A course is usually worth 3 units, with some worth 6, 9 or 12. Information about all courses can be found in Course Planner.
- Some courses have restrictions and/or prerequisites (i.e. other courses you must complete first) - check Course Planner to make sure you meet these, if applicable.
- If you think you might like to undertake an internship or go on exchange, plan early in your degree so you don't miss out.
