PROGRAM STRUCTURE

UNITS AND LEVELS	<p>You must complete a total of 72 units of courses, with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>at least 12 units and no more than 24 units of Level 1 courses (including ARTS 1007);</i> • <i>at least 24 units of Level 3 courses.</i>
CORE COURSE	ARTS 1007/OL The Enquiring Mind – all students must complete this course.
PHILOSOPHY, POLITICS & ECONOMICS	<p>You must complete 48 units of Philosophy, Politics & Economics (PPE) courses, which includes 15 units of PPE Closed Electives, consisting of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 6 units of Level 1 Politics courses • 3 units of Level 2 Politics courses • 6 units of Level 2 Philosophy courses
PPE MAJOR	A major is a sequence of courses in one discipline - you will extend your focus in one specific area with additional courses to the value of 15 units from one of the following: Philosophy, Politics, or Economics.
INTERNSHIP	<p>You must complete one of the following three options, totalling 6 units:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A 6 unit internship: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ ARTS 3202 Research-based Internship, <i>or</i> ○ POLIS 3111EX South Australian Parliamentary Internship • A 3 unit internship (options below) plus a 3 unit ECON, PHIL or POLIS major course: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ ARTS 3100 Community Engagement Learning Project, ○ ARTS 3201/EX Industry Internship III, <i>or</i> ○ PROF 3500/OL Professions Internship • 6 units of ECON, PHIL or POLIS courses – permission required (see notes below)

PLEASE NOTE

- The course lists for Closed Electives and Majors and can be found on the Faculty of Arts website.
- Students may apply to the program convenor for permission to waive the requirement to take an internship course. Permission will be given only if the student completes an approved internship program with a reputable external provider that is not offered or accessible as part of the University's internship courses.
- A course is usually worth 3 units, with some worth 6, 9 or 12. Information about all courses can be found in Course Planner.
- Some courses have restrictions and/or prerequisites (i.e. other courses you must complete first) - check Course Planner to make sure you meet these, if applicable.
- If you think you might like to undertake an internship or go on exchange, plan early in your degree so you don't miss out.
