

The M Rees George Memorial Prize Rules

In 1933, the South Australian Branch of the League of the Empire and the Old Scholars of the Advanced School for Girls paid £200 to the University to establish a prize in French in memory of the late Miss Madeline Rees George.

This is an endowed prize with the capital held in the University's Endowment Fund¹ and the income distribution each year used to fund the prize.

The following rules now apply:-

Title

The Prize shall be called the "M Rees George Memorial Prize".

Value

The Prize shall be awarded annually and the value of the Prize is \$300, or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the Prize does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Prize, candidates must be female and be undertaking first year French subjects in the Bachelor of Arts degree in the year for which the Prize is awarded.

Selection of Candidate

The Prize will be awarded to the female candidate who has achieved the highest aggregate mark in order of merit for first year French subjects undertaken as part of the degree of Bachelor of Arts.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the Prize will not be awarded in that year and the available distribution of interest may be used in subsequent years.

Variations

The University may vary the Rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and [policies](#).
