PROGRAM STRUCTURE

UNITS AND LEVELS	You must complete a total of 72 units of courses, with: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> at least 12 units and no more than 24 units of Level 1 courses at least 24 units of Level 3 courses.
CORE	All students must complete a course totalling 3 units chosen from the Arts Core Competency list.
CRIMINOLOGY	You must complete 45 units of Criminology courses, which includes 15 units of Criminology closed elective courses.
PSYCHOLOGY MINOR*	You must complete a total of 21 units of Psychology courses, as detailed on page 2.
ELECTIVES	You must complete a total of 3 units of elective courses.

The minimum requirement for entry into Honours in Psychology is a 33-unit major in psychology. A minor in psychology is **not accredited** by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) and will not lead to the Honours year.
