### PROGRAM STRUCTURE

<b>UNITS AND LEVELS</b>	You must complete a total of 96 units of courses, with: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 24 units of Level 1 courses</li> <li>• 24 units of Level 2 courses</li> <li>• 48 units of Level 3 courses</li> </ul>
<b>INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS</b>	You must complete 30 units of International relations courses, which includes 15 units of International Relations Closed Electives.
<b>LANGUAGE STUDIES</b>	You must complete at least 9 units in Language Studies, with 6 units of Language at Level 1, and 3 units of Language or Culture at Level 2. Exemptions may apply (see below). You may choose to complete a full language minor (18 units). Available language: Chinese, French, German, Indonesian, Italian, Modern Greek, Japanese, or Spanish.
<b>ELECTIVES</b>	You must complete 9 units of elective courses or an additional 9 units of language studies courses to complete a minor of 18 units in the chosen language
<b>ECONOMICS</b>	You must complete 48 units of Economics courses, including 6 units from the list below. Economics courses are a guide only - contact the Faculty of Professions for advice.
