Enrolment Advice into Curriculum & Pedagogy courses for 2022:

Some Curriculum and Pedagogy (C&P) courses are taught in Groups

In 2022, some of the C&P courses will be taught in groups. Please find the groups below.

Where C&P courses for both your teaching areas are taught in the same group, you will need to **enrol into each of your relevant courses, but only attend the one tutorial.**

For example, if your teaching areas (TA) are Spanish and German, they will both be part of the Languages group and the following tutorials are available:

- *Tuesdays 5-8pm*
- *Thursdays 5-8pm*

*You will need to enrol into **the same tutorial** for both courses. For example, if you choose the Tuesday tutorial for the Spanish TA you **ALSO** need to enrol into the Tuesday tutorial for the German TA.*

Please ensure you enrol into both teaching areas, but only attend one tutorial per week (where your TA is in the same group).

Fill in a timetable Clash Resolution Form to enrol:

When you attempt to enrol in the tutorial at the same time, you will receive a timetable clash error, because our system is set up to avoid timetabling clashes. An Enrolment Request ID number will be generated in Access Adelaide. This number must be recorded on the form so the Arts Faculty Office can assess the enrolment request.
