

MARY BAKER SCHOLARSHIP SCHOLARSHIP RULES

BACKGROUND

The Mary Baker Scholarship was established in 2009 from a bequest of \$100,000 to the University by Mary Elizabeth Baker for the purposes of the Elder Conservatorium of Music, School of Performing Arts. The University has established a scholarship in the Elder Conservatorium of Music.

The following rules are hereby made:

RULES OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

- 1. The Scholarship shall be known as the "Mary Baker Scholarship".
- 2. Recipients must be Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens, permanent residents of Australia or holders of a permanent humanitarian visa> undertaking study as a Commonwealth supported student and must remain enrolled on a full-time basis in the program for which the scholarship was approved.
- 3. The annual value of the Scholarship is \$5,000 payable in two equal instalments direct to the student following confirmation of enrolment and satisfactory academic progress after each of the census dates (usually March and August each year).
- 4. One scholarship shall be awarded annually to a commencing student based on their entry audition results.
- 5. The scholarship will be offered in perpetuity.
- 6. Only one scholarship will be tenable at any one time. A new scholarship will not be offered until completion or termination of an existing scholarship.
- 7. The Scholarship will provide assistance with education and living costs for three years for which the recipient is offered the Scholarship, subject to the students maintaining a Grade Point Average of at least 4 (pass average) in each semester of enrolment.
- 8. The scholarship must be taken up in the year in which it is offered; acceptance of the scholarship offer cannot be deferred. If a student declines the scholarship offer, the scholarship will be offered to the next eligible student.
- 9. The scholarships shall be administered by the Coursework Scholarships Office of the University.
- 10. Direct allocation of the successful candidate will be made by the Director of the Elder Conservatorium of Music who shall determine in any given year which instrument and/or area of study shall be the focus for the scholarship according to entry audition results.

- 11. The scholarship will be terminated where:
 - a student ceases to be enrolled in the approved program of study at the University;
 - a student has provided false or misleading information with regard to their personal details;
 - a student has failed to maintain satisfactory academic progress for two consecutive semesters;
 - a student is guilty of serious misconduct in terms of the University Policy Rules for Student Conduct in the University.
- 12. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
